i. Video sessions

The education committee of ISNACC initiated the concept of Video-based lecture sessions with the intent to improve the clinical practice of Neuroanesthesiologists and Neurointensivists. Video-based lecture series are a vital component of the multimodal teaching approach that will aid in the better understanding of the subject and also facilitate interaction with experts in the field. The first video session was conducted on August 19th, 2022, on the topic “Basics of perioperative EEG and EEG-based monitoring for Anesthesiologists.” The target audience consisted primarily of Anesthesiologists and Intensivists, including junior and senior residents from across the country. The session was moderated by senior faculties who enriched it by contributing from their experience in the field. The webinar was well attended and received overwhelming responses. The audience was delighted with the program and felt that these sessions were relevant to their practice. Most respondents stated that their perioperative practice has improved based on the the topic discussed. Henceforth, ISNACC Video Session webinars will be conducted every 6-8 weeks,

The second Video session was held on October 21st, 2022. Dr Ratan Chelani enriched us on “Adenosine Flow arrest and it’s application in Neuroanesthesia” and Dr Keta Thakkar on “IONM guided Neuroprotection during Aneurysm clipping”. The two experienced faculties, Dr Joseph Monteiro, Senior consultant Neuroanesthesia at PD Hinduja Mumba, and Dr. Sudhir V, Addl. Professor, NIMHANS moderated the session. Nearly 140 delegates joined the session on zoom plateform. Delegates mainly included practising neuroanesthesiologists and Neuroanesthesia residents from across India and south east Asia. The session was moderated by Dr. Georgene Singh, Professor & Head, Department of Neuroanaesthesia, Christian Medical College, Vellore, Dr. Hemant Bhagat, Professor Division of Neuroanaesthesia, Postgraduate Institute of Education and Research, Chandigarh and Dr. Ajay Prasad Hrishi, Additional Professor, Department of Neuroanaesthesia and critical care, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical

Sciences & Technology, Trivandrum. The session was coordinated by Dr. Rajeeb Kumar Mishra, Associate Professor, Department of Neuroanaesthesia and Neurocritical care, National Institute of Mental Health And Neurosciences, Bengaluru. The target audience consisted primarily of anesthesiologists and intensivists, including junior and senior residents from across the country.

The webinar was well attended (almost a hundred attendees) and received overwhelming responses. The audience was delighted with the program and felt that these sessions were relevant to their practice. Most respondents stated that their perioperative practice has improved based on the topic discussed.

iii. Journal Club

None of us is as smart as all of us!

A journal club was conducted as a part of the Indian Society of Neuroanaesthesiology and Critical Care (ISNACC) e-education initiative. The first journal club held on 18th November 2022, saw encouraging participation across the institutes. The session was hosted by Dr. Ashish Bindra, Professor, of Neuroanaesthesiology and Critical Care, at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. Two recent studies addressing brain temperature influences on intracranial pressure (A CENTER -TBI Study) and effect of general anesthesia versus conscious sedation for endovascular treatment of posterior circulation stroke (CANVAS II trial) were very lucidly presented by Dr. Neha and Dr. Deepak Ganjigare P respectively. The short presentations by the residents of the department of Neuroanaesthesiology and Critical Care, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi summarised the key findings and methodology of the studies. The discussion part was taken over by the moderators Dr. Surya Kumar Dube, Additional Professor, Neuroanesthesiology and Critical Care, AIIMS, New Delhi, and Dr. Siddharth Chavali, Senior Consultant, AIG Hospital, Hyderabad.

Dr. Surya Kumar Dube generated a good discussion by addressing the nuances of brain temperature monitoring and its role in neurocritical care settings. This paper was picked up for its data on brain temperature. Despite many studies on hypothermia as a cerebral protectant not many centers in the world practice brain temperature monitoring.

Dr. Siddharth Chavali reviewed the literature on the role of different anesthetic techniques for the endovascular treatment of acute ischemic stroke and highlighted how these results apply to the posterior circulation acute ischemic stroke. The study addresses the posterior circulation stroke while the earlier literature mainly focussed on anterior circulation acute ischemic stroke. The audience raised many relevant questions and was invited to participate in the ongoing discussion.

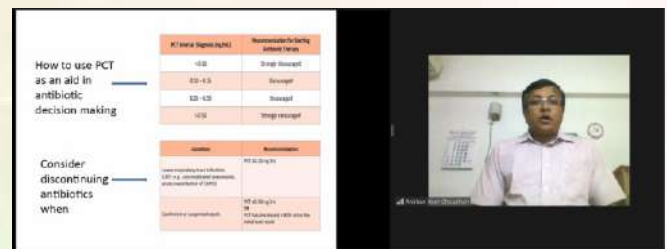
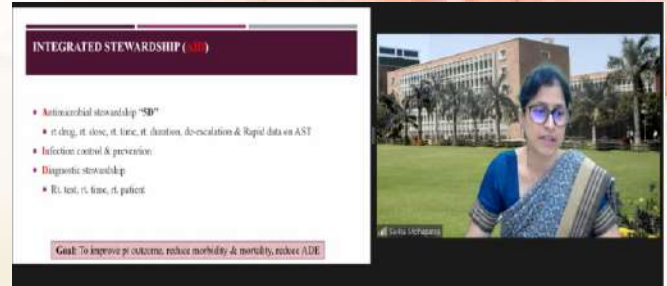
Sepsis Symposium
